NEW FLU ATTACKS UNIVERSITY OF SHIMANE

New influenza virus is spreading quickly around the world.


THIS YEAR, a new influenza virus developed around the world and it is a threat to the world. The first development place was Mexico. This initial infection occurred in April. Japan confirmed cases of the new influenza on May 16th.

After that, the new influenza virus spread across Japan to Hamada and Shimane University. Worldwide, the number of deaths rose to about 5000 people, according to the latest WHO tally. The number of people infected with this influenza virus has reached about 400000. At the University of Shimane as of Nov 24th, we have had 33 cases of new influenza.

The symptoms are sudden fever (over 38 degrees Celsius in most cases), cough, sore throat, running nose, headache, arthritis, muscular pain, diarrhea, etc.. Most patients have mild cases with the fever coming down in several days and recovery in about one week. However, special attention is necessary for those with other diseases, for this might cause complications and

result in a severe case. The latent period is the period from the infection of the virus untill the symptoms appear. This is about 2~4 days, maximum 7 days.

New influenza patients keep on increasing in Japan. So doses of the vaccine are lacking. This problem would be best to solve as quickly as possible.

BIG PROBLEMS FOR LOCAL AIRPORTS

A GROUP of students of the University of Shimane researched airports on September 10 and 11, 2009.

They were the students who belong to Professor Tanaka's Seminar of the University of Shimane. The university was established in 2000. They study business administration. The members of the seminar were seven students; one senior, three juniors and three sophomores. They are good friends.

They studied the activation of Hagi-Iwami Airport which is in Masuda City in Shimane Prefecture. Now, the regional airports are in a severe condition and Hagi-Iwami Airport is in the most severe condition compared to other airports in the region. The seminar members hoped to find a way to activate the airport and Iwami Area.

During this summer, they researched airports. They decided to do research of neighboring airports: Hiroshima and Izumo. They contacted airport officials and sent them some questions to interview them.

They went to Hiroshima Airport on September 10, 2009. This airport is in Hiroshima Prefecture. It was a large airport. The airport seems to be the best airport in the Chugoku Region of Japan. There were many people there. They went to interview Mr. Takanisihi who was a staff of the terminal building.

He talked about the conditions and their efforts on the airport. The airport held many events. The scale of this airport was different from that of Hagi-lwami Airport because the airport was well-known within the country. After the students interviewed Mr. Takanishi, they went up to the control tower. This was very exciting. It was a valuable experience for them.

Then, the students went to Izumo Airport on September 11, 2009. This airport is the best airport in the Sanin Area. The airport is in Shimane Prefecture, like Hagi-Iwami Airport. However, this airport was busier than Hagi-Iwami Airport because this airport is in Hikawa Town, which succeeds in attracting of enterprises. Therefore, the nuber of flights to and from the airport increased.

HAMADA VOTES


On Sunday October 18th, in Hamada, two kinds of elections were taken placed. One is choosing the next mayor. The other is choosing members of the Hamada Diet.

BEFORE COMING the Election Day, there were many election cars in Hamada city. Many candidates said their own political plan for Hamada, while driving own election car and made speeches somewhere. The next mayor Tetsuo Uzu who won this election emphasized two things.

First, he could make Hamada Medical Treatment Center transfer to a new place where is near Hamada Station. Second, he made Hamada and four small cities be merged in 2005. So, he can make the economy in Hamada be better than before merging.

On the Election Day, about eighty percent citizens go to the election places and voted. After the election time, counting votes started soon. At midnight on Monday October 19th, the next mayor and new members of the Hamada

The voter turnout was 76.83 percent, with about 72 percent of the voters expressed support for the incumbent. Mayor Uzu, who was elected for his fifth term, faces many difficult issues such as the budget deficit, unemployment, privatization of day care centers, etc.

Diet were decided. The next mayor Uzu is relaxed after hearing the result. And, he said, "I should come back to the first intension." He will tackle several things for Hamada. For example, pushing project brand-name goods whose are agriculture, forestry and fisheries.

KYOTO NINJA!


A student of the University of Shimane visited a strange café in Kyoto on September 13, 2009.

THE DEVELOPMENT OF INTERNATIONAL TOURISM **MARKET**

Strengthening the ties between Russia and Japan through tourism!

OVER THE last years the Russian Federation and Japan have made active efforts to strengthen international relations and develop tourism. Thus, the Memorandum of the collaboration in

the field of tourism between the Japanese Government and the Government of the Russian Federation was accepted on January 13th, 1998. In 2000, the Agreement on cultural relations was concluded between the government of Russian Federation and the Japanese Government. The intention was to encourage international tourism and readiness to encourage incentives to develop international tourism was stated by the heads of these two countries in the Plan, which was accepted on January 10th, 2003.

Accepting the program of strengthening collaboration between the Russian Federation and Japan on November 21st, 2005 was an important step for development of collaboration of mutual rela tions. This Program was signed in presence of the President of Russia, Vladimir Putin, and the Prime-minister of Japan Junichiro Koizumi.

Of course, the activity of both countries in the field of tourism in the frames of concluded agreements have influence the positive dynamics of international tourists flows in Russia and Japan recently.

Taking into consideration world tourism trends, with Asia Pacific Region countries playing a major role, the Far Eastern region of Russia, including Primorsky Krai, gains importance.

Primorsky Krai is located in the south-east of Russia and covers 164,7 thousand square business (45%). During rest and recreational trips, Japanese travelers prefer the geographical proximity of Primorsky Krai to Asian Pacific countries (China, Republic of Korea, Japan), its favorable climate, significant amounts of natural resources and reach cultural heritage. For example, most of the world's population of Siberian Tigers are found in Primor-

The rate of Japanese visitors in Primorsky Krai has remained approximately the same since 2001, but fell to 5,5 thousand in 2008. The rate of movements of tourists from Russia into Japan changed more dramatically: from 3,3 thousand in 2001 to 12 thousand in 2005 and 9,6 thousand in 2008. The analysis of the tourists market for Japanese travelers in Vladivostok has shown that Primorsky Krai is generally visited by middle aged tourists (70%), 90 % of which use cars and prefer individual tours (60%) and short-tem trips (90%). The basic purposes of visiting Vladivostok are leisure, recreation, rest (50%) and to purchase cultural-cognitive tours (97%) and ecological tours (3%). The main directions of tourism development between Primorsky Krai and Japan are cultural-cognitive, ecological and business tourism. Now, an unusual interest to outbound tourism is seen at the tourists market in Primorsky Krai, because every other citizen of Primorsky Krai has traveled abroad. Unfortunately, tours and journeys to Japan constitute only 10 % of all outbound tourism for citizens of Primorsky Krai. However, there is a great potential of development of international tourism between these regions.
